Open to sophomores, juniors and seniors only.

III. LAS: ECONOMICS

ECON 322 ECONOMIC HISTORY AND MODERNIZATION OF THE MIDDLE EAST (4, Irregular)

Economic history of the Middle East from the rise of Islam to the modern era. Roles of law, religion. Processes of institutional transformation, stagnation, modernization. Prerequisite: ECON 203.

• APPROVED. Affected department acknowledgement was requested from and provided by the chairs of History and International Relations. The Economics department is urged to inform the following relevant schools and departments about this course, which might be useful to their students: International Relations, History, Political Science, Anthropology, Religion, and Linguistics (where the Arabic and Middle East Studies Minor is housed).

NEW: ECON 342 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE MIDDLE EAST (4, FaSp)
Contemporary economic problems of the Middle East: comparative and historical
perspectives on issues of institutions, investment, oil, trade, migration, finance, inequality,
labor and capital markets. Prerequisite: ECON 203; recommended preparation: ECON 205
and ECON 303.

OLD: ECON 342 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE MIDDLE EAST (4)
Historical and comparative analysis of economies of Middle Eastern countries: institutions, resources, trade, finance, income distribution, population, migration. Prerequisite: ECON 203 or ECON 205.

HIST 271 EARLY NATIVE AMERICAN STORIES (4, Sp)

An exploration of the history of Native America peoples and the ways they understood and explained the changes in their lives from 1492 to 1840. Concurrent enrollment: MDA 140.
